Inspiration for your Home & Garden

Any wall or fence can support a wide range of climbers and wall shrubs.

Although conditions on some walls and fences can be extreme, choosing plants that can cope with these conditions will reap rewards. South and West facing walls can get very hot and dry in summer, North and East facing walls can stay frozen in frosty weather when the low sun can't reach them. There is also the type of soil to be considered

Some climbers cling naturally but many will need some help. Use string to tie long shoots on to a trellis or wires attached to a wall with eye hooks. Those with curling tendrils will then attach themselves as they grow. Most wall shrubs need to be supported and will benefit from being trained into a fan shape, bearing many more flowers from horizontal stems.
